Expert Witness & Surveillance



Expert or Professional Witness:

Expert or professional witness practitioners provide a service to the courts which is impartial and unbiased in relation to matters within their expertise in order to assist the court with making informed directions and decisions in regards to matters that they hear.

Expert evidence is admissible to equip the court with information which is likely to be outside the knowledge of a judge or jury and an expert witness can provide the court with a statement of opinion on any admissible matter calling for expertise by the witness if they are qualified to give such an opinion.

Our expert witnesses are well versed in Criminal Practice Directions 19A of 2020 and Criminal Procedure Rules 19 of 2020 with particular focus on Criminal Procedure Rules 19.2. 19.3 & 19.4 which outline an expert's duty to the court, their suitability as a credible witness and what content may be included in an expert witness report, and also in regards to Common Law which dictates where admissible evidence will be of assistance to the court and that the expert witness does in fact have the relevant experience to be able to provide such opinion.

Currently, our expert witness service provides opinion on two crime types namely Anti-Social Behaviour and illegal Drug Supply of Class A substances namely Heroin, Crack Cocaine, Cocaine Hydrochloride, and Class B supply namely cannabis (including growing facilities / equipment).





Surveillance:

There are times in an investigation when administrative efforts, research and the gathering of evidence only go so far in achieving certain aims. In order to bring an investigation to a satisfactory conclusion for a client, it may well be required that surveillance tactics are employed in order to gain best evidence and achieve the final objectives originally set.

RAGE offers a number of surveillance services, these being static observations, mobile and foot surveillance officers and technical surveillance assets.

All personnel used for such activities are suitably trained, qualified and with proven track records of engagements in such disciplines either from the military or civilian police services. Our operatives are well versed in legislation governing such activities namely The Regulation of Investigatory Powers Act 2000 (RIPA 2000), that whilst is not binding for a private company such as ourselves, RAGE seeks to conform to the act as closely as possible with close attention given to such aspects as proportionality and collateral intrusion.

This is a highly specialized service provided by RAGE and as such due to its sensitive nature specific details of personnel and tactics are not discussed directly with clients however written guarantees of national accredited courses and training that staff have had are available for examination and verification.
